#### Holy Communion and Absolution

On Maundy Thursday, we give an absolution as the first step of Holy Communion and do this by station. First, we hear a personal absolution—that we are loved, forgiven and freed to be ourselves. A pastor will place their hands on your head for the blessing, call you by name, and speak those words of God's forgiveness to you. So please, either bring a scrap of paper forward with your full name on it so the pastor can call you by name (available before worship in the Narthex)...or whisper your full name (first, middle, last) to the pastor who is pronouncing the absolution. After the absolution, the next person at the station will give you a gluten-free bread that you will dip into the wine or grape juice that the next person at the station is holding. If by chance, you forget and put the bread into your mouth—no problem—eat it and take a fresh one to dip into the wine or grape juice. We will have plenty available. Everyone is welcome at the table of our Lord. Children who are not yet fully communing are offered gluten-free bread and a blessing. The Lord's Supper is for all people.

The Great Thanksgiving P: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you. P: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Words of Institution - 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

<sup>23</sup> For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, <sup>24</sup> and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." <sup>25</sup> In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." <sup>26</sup> For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.
